## RISING GAS PRICES IMPACTING WASHINGTON STATE DRIVERS

Gasoline prices are higher this summer than during the last four summers, according to the U.S. Energy Information Administration (EIA).<sup>1</sup> Across the country, summer gasoline prices are averaging \$2.87 per gallon, 53 cents higher than last summer. Diesel fuel, essential for transporting American goods to market, has increased an average of 66 cents this summer, to \$3.20 per gallon.<sup>2</sup>

Elevated gas prices are a burden on every American family and business and threaten our nation's continued economic growth and global competitiveness. The current run-up in prices is effectively a tax on every American family's discretionary budget, particularly in Washington state where drivers pay the third highest gas prices in the nation. Washington gas prices 3<sup>rd</sup> highest in nation

In Washington, consumers use an average of 236 million gallons of gasoline each month.<sup>3</sup> Since gasoline prices are 60 cents per gallon higher in Washington than a year ago, increased gasoline prices will cost drivers approximately \$142 million more per month compared to what they paid last year. During the peak summer driving season, <u>Washington state consumers will pay \$452 million more than they paid last summer.</u>

The average household in Washington consumes 78 gallons of gasoline each month and 249 gallons during the peak summer driving season. <sup>4</sup> That means <u>the average household in Washington will pay \$149 more in fuel</u> <u>costs this summer driving season</u> as compared to the same period last year.
